

DIGITAL INCLUSION PROJECT

The Digital Inclusion Project was created with the purpose of contributing to the local community, in order to provide the opportunity, especially for people in the 3rd age, knowing computer resources, strengthening its relationships with technology and entering them in the context of modernity.

With the participation of monitors students, the course is developed in the Laboratory of Informatic of Fatec Itapetininga in two classes per week for three months. The monitors are students of Graduation Courses in Fatec Itapetininga and are responsible for learning, teaching seniors from turning on the computer, preparing a manuscript, use spreadsheets, create slides, surf the Internet, even send emails and participate in social networks.



The first class began in 2007, when the project was geared to parents of students and people in the 3rd age, this time with the support of local businesses and several students and teachers who participated in this important project, first under the Coordination of the Teachers Eva Fagundes Weber, Lauro de Oliveira Carvalho and Denilce Veloso.

After a suspended period, the project was reworked and incorporated in 2012, has since been formed five classes of 35 students on average; during this period with the participation of Prof. Andreia Rodrigues Casare and currently under the supervision of Prof. José Antonio de Almeida Castanho and coordination of Prof. Eva Fagundes Weber, beyond the strategic support of the intern Elaine Oliveira, student of Analysis and Systems Development.

The success of this project is complete because, in addition to service to the community, enables Fatec's students exercise their citizenship and Fatec act with social responsibility. Every new semester there is always a waiting list of people in the community interested in becoming a student of this program and be included in the digital age.
